"O Eternal and most gracious God, who in thy upper house, the heavens, though there be many mansions, yet art alike and equally in every mansion: but here in thy lower house, though thou fillest all, yet are otherwise in some rooms thereof than in others; otherwise in thy church than in my chamber, and otherwise in the sacraments than in my prayers; so though thou be always present and always working in every room of this thy house, my body, yet I humbly beseech thee to manifest always a more effectual presence in my heart than in the other offices. Into the house

of thine anointed. Disloyal persons, traitors will come; into thy house, the church, hypocrites and idolators will come; in some rooms of this house, my body, temptations will come, infections will come; but be my heart thy bedchamber, O my God and thither let them not enter."


But it is a costly grace, this salvation, for it demands the death of the spirit perverted by sin in order to bring new life in the Spirit. As found in the prayer of St Francis:
